#### Article 6 - International cooperation and assistance

Provided financial assistance in 2022 for implementation of Articles 3 and 4 through the United Nations Mine Action Service, and Article 5 through the International Committee of the Red Cross

Provided financial assistance in 2022 for mine action to: Cambodia, Colombia, Iraq, Lao PDR, Palestine, and the ASEAN Regional Mine Action Centre

Initial transparency report submitted on 31 January 2011

Annual reports submitted covering: 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022

# **Article 9 - National implementation measures**

Enacted Cluster Munitions Prohibition Act 2009 that includes penal sanctions as required by the CCM

Prepared model legislation for small States not possessing and not contaminated by cluster munitions (presented at 2MSP and available on the CCM website)

Produced a short view to help States Parties implement the Convention's provisions domestically (presented at 10MSP and available on the <u>CCM website</u>)
