Article 3 - Stockpile destruction and retention

Completed destruction of its cluster munition stockpiles in March 2014

Has retained some submunitions for training purposes in accordance with Article 3.6

Article 4 - Clearance and risk reduction education

Does not have any contamination in areas under its jurisdiction or control

Article 5 - Victim assistance

Does not have cluster munition victims

Article 6 - International cooperation and assistance

Provided financial assistance in 2017 for implementation of Articles 4 and 5 through Danish Mine Action Strategy and Work Plan, and in its Development Policy

Article 7 - Transparency measures

Initial transparency report submitted on 27 January 2011

Annual reports submitted covering: 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017

Article 9 - National implementation measures

Existing law - *Law on Weapons and Explosives* - which include penal sanctions, is considered by Denmark as sufficient to implement the CCM

Issued a "Guide to responsible investment" recommending investors to respect international norms and conventions including the CCM
