Provided financial assistance in 2018 for implementation of Article 4 or 5 to: Iraq, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Syria and Yemen

Enacted <u>Cluster Munitions Prohibition Act 2009</u> that includes penal sanctions as required by the CCM

Prepared model legislation for small States not possessing and not contaminated by cluster munitions (presented at 2MSP and available on the CCM website)
