Completed destruction of its cluster munition stockpiles in September 2015

Article 4 - Clearance and risk reduction education

Does not have any contamination in areas under its jurisdiction or control

Article 5 - Victim assistance

Does not have cluster munition victims

Article 6 - International cooperation and assistance

Provided financial assistance in 2017 for mine action (including cluster munitions) to: Afghanistan, Colombia, Iraq, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Libya, Myanmar, South Sudan, Central African Republic, Syria, Yemen, and globally

Most of the funding is channelled through the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency

Annual reports submitted covering: 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017

Article 9 - National implementation measures
