Article 6 - International cooperation and assistance

Provided financial assistance in 2018 for mine action (including cluster munitions) to: Afghanistan, Algeria/Western Sahara, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Colombia, Iraq, Lebanon, Libya, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Syria, Ukraine, Yemen, Zimbabwe and globally

Most of the funding was channelled through the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency
