Article 3 - Stockpile destruction and retention

Does not have cluster munition stockpiles

Article 4 - Clearance and risk reduction education

Clearance obligation deadline: Extended to 1 October 2024

All known areas contaminated with cluster munitions cleared and released on 20 October 2021, only 5 departments in Tibesti need to be surveyed to verify extent of cluster munition contamination

Main obstacle in achieving compliance is financial (PRODECO funding by European Union ended in September 2021)

Submitted extension request that was considered at the 10MSP; analysis of the request can be found here

Has cluster munition victims

National focal point designated

National Action Plan for Victim Assistance (PANAV) awaiting adoption by the Ministry of Planning

State Party to Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities since 20 June 2019

Has requested assistance to fulfil Articles 4 and 5 obligations

Received assistance from UNICEF in 2022 that benefited 49 victims
