Estimated contaminated area: 600 m² in 6 areas, based on 2015 and 2017 NTS operations

No new contamination found but contamination in several regions recorded by UNMAS and the Somali Explosive

Management Authority (SEMA) in the past

No survey conducted in recent years due to lack of international financial support

Has cluster munition victims

National focal point designated

State Party to Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities since 6 August 2019

Has requested assistance to fulfil Articles 4 and 5 obligations

Receiving assistance from various organizations including UNMAS, ICRC and (to fulfil Article 4 and 5 obligations)
