

Fourth Meeting of States Parties of the Convention on Cluster Munitions

SWITZERLAND

Co-operation and assistance

Lusaka, 13 September 2013

Mr. President

Co-operation and assistance are in our view of crucial importance for the implementation of the

convention. As Switzerland expressed earlier, we share conclusions that in light of the increasing-

ly scarce resources available, it is important that the means are utilized in a coordinated, coherent

and complementary manner.

Switzerland's efforts in assistance are guided by its whole of government strategy covering the

period 2012-2015, a strategy which includes not only cluster munitions but also antipersonnel

mines and other explosive remnants of war. The strategy is based on the relevant international

and legally binding instruments. We share the views expressed by the co-coordinators and the

presidency that co-operation and assistance should rely on and take into account long term na-

tional plans developed by recipient States. The display of ownership by building national capacity

is pivotal for us. It appears to us also very important that affected States seeking assistance

communicate in a structured and transparent way about their needs and that a substantive dia-

logue is developed between recipient and donor states.

In this context, reporting plays a key role in the provision of assistance. Switzerland bases its

funding decisions, inter alia, on the transparency reports provided under article 7. Precise reports

providing comparable data and both quantifying and qualifying the remaining challenges facilitate

effective resource allocation.

I would also like to seize this opportunity to stress that Switzerland places great importance on

the inclusion and the mainstreaming of gender aspects in its decision to support projects. We are

convinced that this aspect should be further enhanced by promoting the inclusion of gender dis-

aggregated data and aspects of gender mainstreaming into project design, monitoring and evalu-

ation. Experience shows that gender aware programming is contributing to the efficiency and the

effectiveness of our common endeavors.
