<p>Article 4 - Clearance and risk reduction education</p>		
<p>Does not have any contamination in areas under its jurisdiction or control</p>		
<p>Article 5 - Victim assistance</p>		
<p>Does not have cluster munition victims</p>		
<p>Article 6 - International cooperation and assistance</p>		
<p>Had requested for assistance to fulfil Article 3 obligations Received technical and financial assistance from UNMAS to fulfil Article 3 obligations from January to February 2013</p>		
<p>Article 7 - Transparency measures</p>		
<p>Initial transparency report submitted on 29 April 2013 Annual reports submitted covering: 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2019</p>		
<p>Article 9 - National implementation measures</p>
