<p>Article 3 - Stockpile destruction and retention</p> <p>Does not have cluster munition stockpiles</p>		
<p>Article 4 - Clearance and risk reduction education</p> <p>Reported suspected cluster munition contaminated area in April 2012</p> <p>After a survey conducted by Norwegian People's Aid in June 2012, Grenada announced in September 2012 that no cluster munition contamination was found and that it had fulfilled all its Article 4 obligations</p>		
<p>Article 5 - Victim assistance</p> <p>Does not have cluster munition victims</p>		
<p>Article 6 - International cooperation and assistance</p> <p>Has requested for assistance to fulfil Articles 4 obligations in April 2012</p> <p>Received assistance from Norwegian People's Aid to fulfil Article 4 obligations</p>		
<p>Article 7 - Transparency measures</p> <p>Initial transparency report submitted on 30 April 2012</p> <p>Annual report submitted covering: 2012 and 2019</p>		
<p>Article 9 - National implementation measures</p> <p>Legislative process stalled and request technical assistance in the review of existing legislations.</p>		
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
