Existing law — Sections 114, 155, 156 and 157 of *Criminal Law (Offenses) Act* of Guyana, *Explosives Act Cap 16:06*, the *Customs Act Cap 82:01* as well as the *Firearms Act of Guyana*, — which include penal sanctions, are considered by Guyana as sufficient to implement the CCM.
