## Invitation to the Intersessional Meeting to the Convention on Cluster Munitions Geneva, 7-9 April 2014

Excellency,

In my capacity as President of the Fourth Meeting of States Parties to the Convention on Cluster Munitions, it is with great pleasure that I invite you to the Intersessional Meeting of the CCM, to be held from 7-9 April 2014, at the World Meteorological Organisation in Geneva.

Organized by the interim Implementation Support Unit at United Nations Development Programme and with support from the Geneva International Centre for Humanitarian Demining, the informal Intersessional meeting is aimed at discussing progress achieved and challenges encountered in matters pertaining to the implementation of the CCM. It is also our intention to capture these updates for the San Jose Progress Report: Monitoring progress in implementing the Vientiane Action Plan between the Fourth and Fifth Meetings of States which I will present to the Fifth Meeting of States Parties later this year in San Jose, Costa Rica.

For ease of planning and travel bookings, I would also like to remind you of the intersessional work and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Preparatory Meeting of the Third Review Conference of the Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Convention (APMBC), which takes place the same week, from 9 to 11 April 2014. You may also wish to note that since 12 December 2008 Switzerland has been an associated Member of the Schengen Agreement and hence Schengen regulations apply for the entry. The process of acquiring a Schengen visa takes up to one month once the application is completed. Therefore it is strongly recommended that delegates contact the Swiss representatives at their place of residence as soon as possible for information about visa application procedures and documents to be presented.
