Peru and the Oslo Process



Peru was part of the "Core Group of the Oslo Process": Norway, Austria, Ireland, Mexico, New Zealand and the Holy See Goal: To negotiate a treaty that would prohibit the use, development, production, transfer, stockpiling, retention and acquisition of cluster munitions.

The Convention on Cluster Munitions was signed in Oslo, Norway, on December 3, 2008, with Peru being one of the signatory countries.







Peru joined the Oslo Convention on September 26, 2012, and it entered into force for our country on March 1, 2013.

The commitment: Destroy its arsenals of cluster bombs.







Peru's Challenge and Assistance from the International Community

In compliance with its obligations under Article 3 of the Oslo Convention, the following were destroyed:

-2,021 Cluster bombs

- 8,445 6 kg bomblets

Peru requested cooperation and assistance from the international community to destroy stockpiles of cluster munitions

In March 2014, the Kingdom of Norway confirmed cooperation for the destruction of cluster munitions in Peru The support of the Kingdom of Norway was channeled through the NGO "Norwegian People's Aid" (NPA)

In 2021, the Convention granted a 37-month extension, with the new compliance date being April 2024.



On 15 December 2023, the destruction of cluster bombs was completed (4 months before the deadline), thus honouring the obligations under the Oslo Convention (Art. 3, stockpile destruction).




