

Annex B-2: Quality control methods

Quality management in mine action is essential for ensuring the safety, efficiency, and effectiveness of mine action activities, including the process and the final product.

LMAC is committed to ensure that the mine action pillars overarching the LMAP are monitored and controlled to achieve LMAC vision.

This will be achieved through:

- The accreditation system.
- The quality assurance system.
- The quality control system.

a- Accreditation:

All mine action organizations willing to contribute to the LMAP will follow an accreditation process to ensure that mine action organizations, teams and individuals are fit for the mine action activities.

b- Quality assurance:

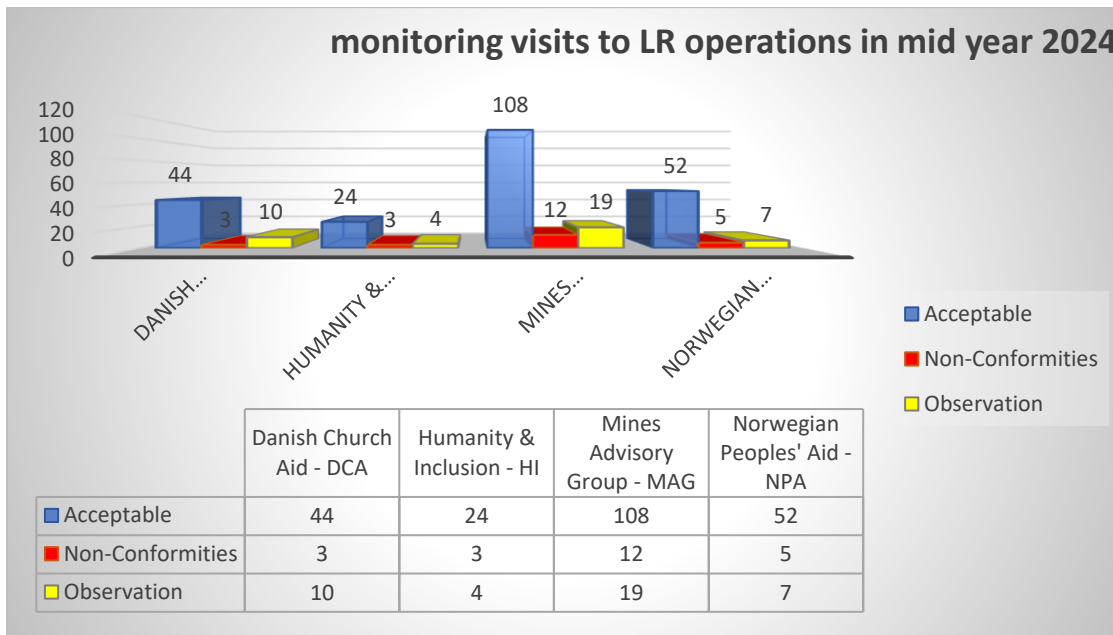
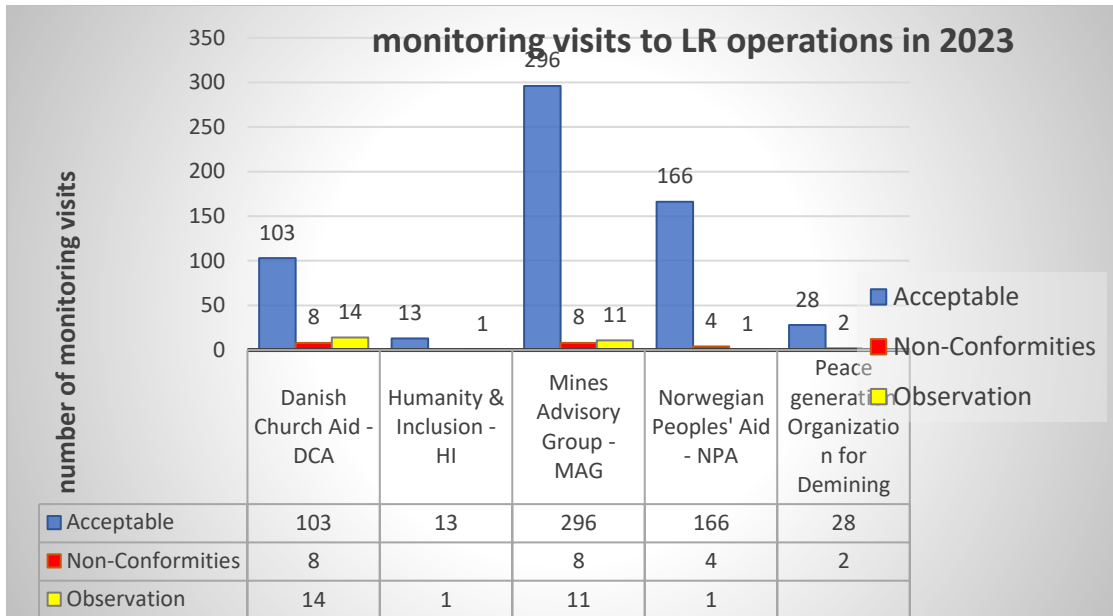
Quality assurance is a pro-active action taken to increase confidence that requirements of all stakeholders will be met.

Below charts represent the QA visits for 2023 and for the mid- year 2024:

It shows LMAC commitment toward quality in mine action, however, the security situation has affected the flow of quality assurance since Oct 2023.

Quality assurance involves also monitoring of NTS teams, EORE and VA projects, these projects are monitored by weekly visits from LMAC or meeting with LMAC section heads to ensure that mine action projects are safe, efficient and effective.

LMAC will continue the monitoring of mine action activities for the extension period, and will profit from lessons learnt for continual improvement.



c- Quality control:

LMAC is committed to release the lands safely to landowners, and LMAC with cooperation with GICHD is working on a liability study for LEBANON.

LMAC will ensure that all lands returned to landowners are safe by following the national mine action standards, the sampling process and post clearance surveys.
