As we know, by nature and design, cluster munitions are indiscriminate and imprecise and they may result in serious breaches of IHL and cause harms long after conflicts have ended. For this reason, Ireland remains committed to the CCM, its goals and its universalisation. We thank the ISU for their important work and assistance they offer to future prospective States Party to the CCM. Ireland is proud to have made voluntary contributions to the ISU and also the almost half a million euros in 2024 for clearing cluster munition remnants.

At this time, we must strengthen our resolve and commitment to universalisation. In line with Action #11 of the Lausanne Action Plan, Ireland will continue to engage in dialogue to promote the norm against the use of cluster munitions. We should not lose sight of the normative power of the Convention. We must continue to build upon gains made through outreach and dialogue with States who are not party to the Convention seeking their partnership in delivering a better future for those living in areas affected by the use of cluster munitions and their remnants.
