# Background

On September 19, 2022, at the 10<sup>th</sup> Meeting of States Parties to the Convention on Cluster Munitions, Chile's 3rd extension request was approved until June 1, 2026.

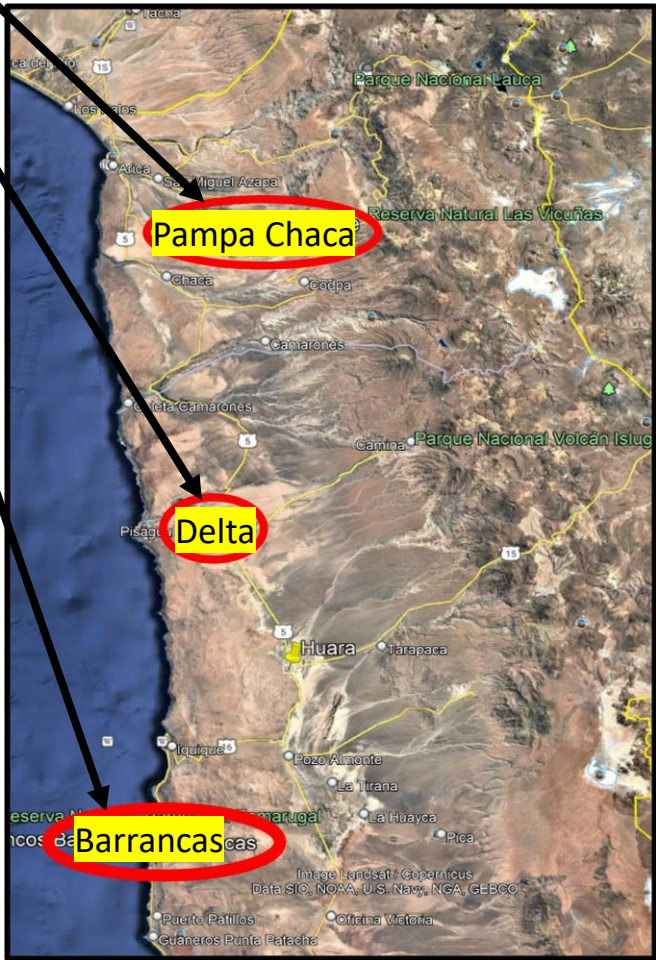
During the 3-year extension period (2023-2026), the following activities were carried out:

- In **2023**, the **clearance and destruction** of cluster munition remnants on the "Punta Zenteno" Air Force range in the Magallanes Region.
- In **2024**, a **new technical survey** was conducted on the Delta Air Force range in the Tarapacá Region, and 8,088,374 m<sup>2</sup> were reduced.
- In **2025**, we are **seeking resources**, requesting international assistance, restructuring our planning and presenting a 4<sup>th</sup> extension request.

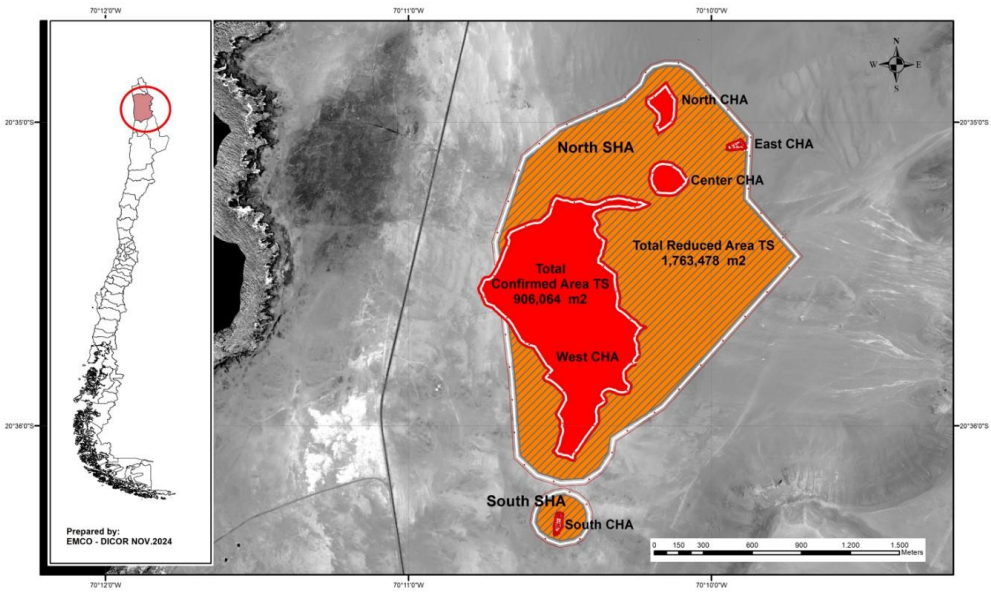




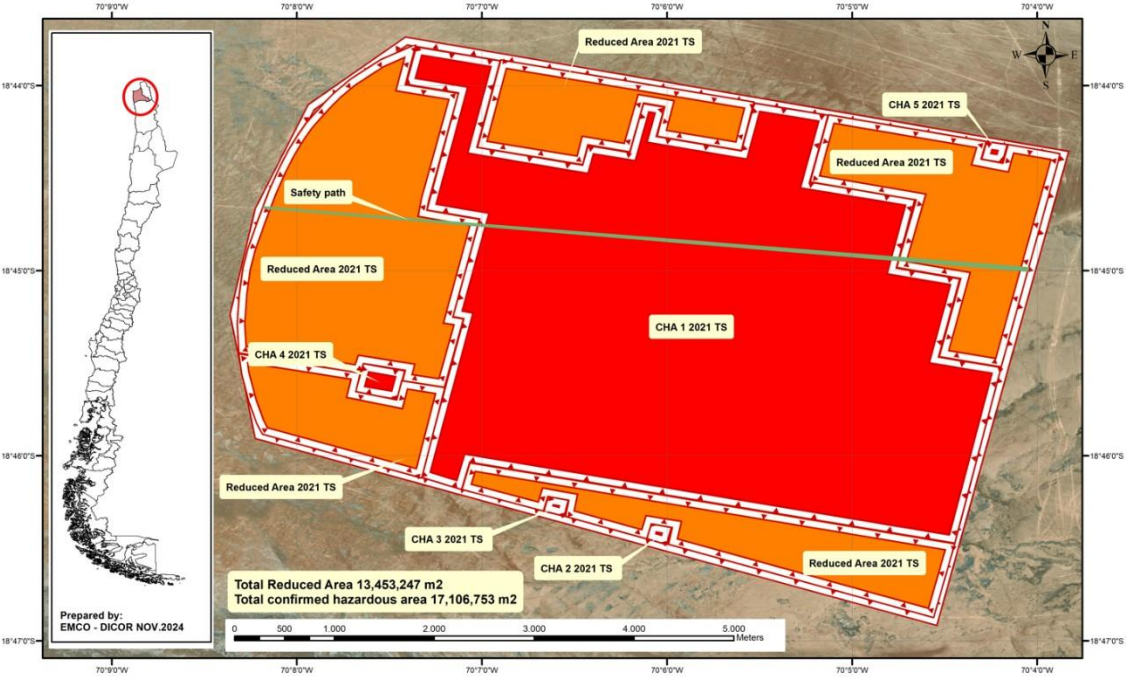

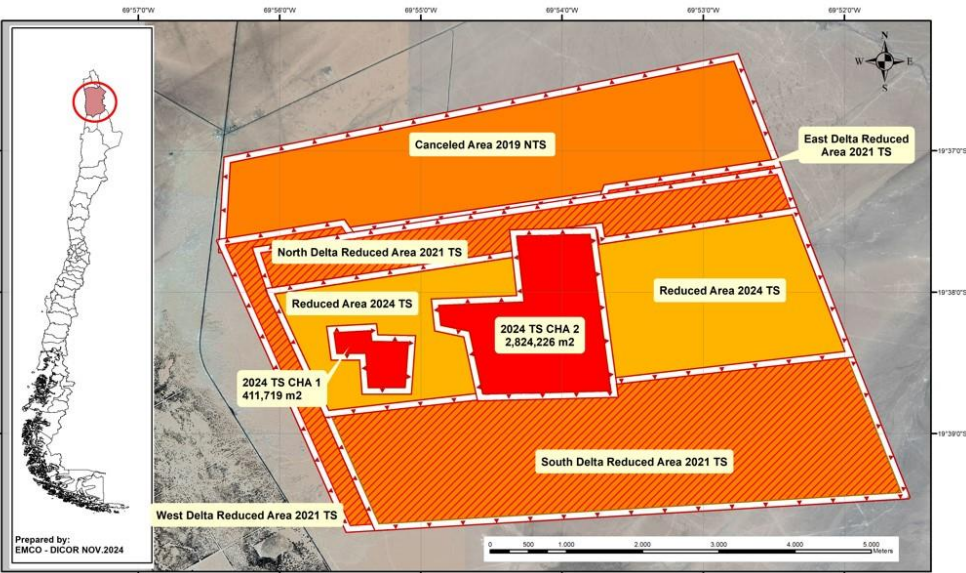
Barrancas Air Force Shooting Range, Tarapacá Region
