Universalisation

Actions 10 and 11 of the LAP

- **124 States** committed to the Convention
 - 112 States Parties and 12 signatories
- **3 States** joined the CCM between 2022 and 2025
- **1 Withdrawal**
- Universalisation is perceived as a **shared responsibility** (Article 21.1)
- **20 States not party** have constantly supported the Convention at the UNGA
- **Actual or apparent obstacles** appear to remain.



Stockpile Destruction

Actions 12 to 17 of the LAP

- **100% Rate:** a success story of the CC
- Signs of proactive **destruction** and **transparency** regarding retained CM
- There is still more potential to improve on transparency on retained CM.



Survey and Clearance

Actions 18 to 26 of the LAP

- 28 States Parties have been subject of Article 4 obligations
- **10 States Parties** will remain with pending obligations after 3RC
- The nature of the **obligations**
- **Research and development** among States Parties
- **Gradual linking clearance to broader sectors** including the areas of the triple nexus.



Risk Education

Actions 27 to 30 of the LAP

- **Stand-alone** agenda item since 12MSP
- Critical role for the **protection of civilians**
- Precise descriptions and relevant accurate **data** are not always present
- Measuring the **impact** remains an objective



Victim Assistance

Actions 31 to 37 of the LAP

- The CCM is a **landmark** in humanitarian disarmament on VA
- **Renewed emphasis** on victim assistance at 2RC
- **evolving scope** and **expectations** of victim assistance
- **Engagement** and **involvement** of victims and survivors is not always done in practice
- **Commitment** and **resources** at national and international level



International Cooperation and Assistance

Actions 38 to 42 of the LAP

- **Increased tendency** of investing **national resources**
- **Innovation** through country coalitions
- **Disparities** in accessing the resources
- Leaving some States Parties **behind**
- **Sustainability** and **predictability**



Transparency and Exchange of Information Measures

Actions 43 to 46 of the LAP

- **Accountability, Monitoring and trust building**
- **Mixed picture:** improvements but also serious gaps
- Reasons for limited engagement with transparency matters
 - Lack of **knowledge**
 - Lack of **capacity, expertise, and resources**
 - Lack of **internal coordination**
- Transparency **has different functions**, including facilitating ICA.



National Implementation Measures

Actions 47 to 48 of the LAP

- **Improvements and shortfalls**
- **Inadequate legislation**
- **Long and endless** legislative processes
- A number of States Parties have **no dedicated legislation**
- Issue regarding the **content of the legislation**



Gender Mainstreaming and Cross-Cutting Issues

Action 8 LAP

Make use of synergies and coordinate responses in implementing the Convention with activities undertaken in relation with mine action, international humanitarian law, human rights law and environmental protection instruments that they are party to, as applicable, and with peacebuilding and sustainable development activities, as relevant.

- **Gradual improvement** in gender mainstreaming
- gap between **theory** and **practice**
