## Information Note

Third Review Conference of the States Parties of the  
Convention on Cluster Munitions (CCM)

### Second Preparatory Meeting

Geneva, 1 July 2026

This note provides participants with logistical information regarding the Second Preparatory Meeting of the Third Review Conference of the States Parties to the Convention on Cluster Munitions (CCM).

#### **Date and Venue**

The Second Preparatory Meeting of the Third Review Conference of the Convention on Cluster Munitions (CCM), is scheduled to take place in Geneva, on Wednesday, 1 July 2026.

The Meeting will be held in Room XVI in Building A of the Palais des Nations, the United Nations Office at Geneva (UNOG), Avenue de la Paix 8-14, 1211 Geneva 10, accessible via the Pregny Gate or the Nations Gate. See map here: <https://www.ungeneva.org/en/about/practical-information/map>.

Note Verbale

States Parties, Signatory States, and States not party wishing to participate in the Second Preparatory Meeting of the CCM Third Review Conference (3RC) are requested to submit a **Note Verbale addressed to the United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs (UNODA)**, which serves as the Secretariat of the meeting, with the CCM Implementation Support Unit (CCM ISU) in copy.

The Note Verbale should indicate their interest in participating in the meeting and include a list of all participants, with the full name and title of each member of the delegation. The head of delegation should be clearly indicated.

In case a member of the delegation does not hold a UN ground pass, registration on Indico at (<https://indico.un.org/event/1016329>) is also necessary.

## E-deleGATE Registration

As of January 2024, the Geneva Branch of the United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs (UNODA) has introduced e-deleGATE to facilitate and expedite its Secretariat functions. Delegations can access the platform at <https://edelegate.un.int/>, where the Convention on Cluster Munitions appears under the “Geneva” tab. Account and user management for delegations are handled by the designated access administrators within Permanent Missions accredited to the United Nations Office at Geneva. Delegation members and relevant Permanent Mission staff should contact their access administrator to obtain access to the Convention-related modules.

All States Parties and other States participating as observers are requested to **use e- deleGATE to register their delegation members** for the Second Preparatory Meeting of the CCM Third Review Conference through the e-List of Participants module. Any changes in the composition of delegations during the Meeting should be updated using the same module. Delegations are also requested to upload their Note Verbale to UNODA via e-deleGATE.

It is essential that the names of all delegates who register in the e-deleGATE platform also appear on the Note Verbale submitted by the respective delegation. Should a delegate registered in the e-deleGATE platform not appear on the Note Verbale submitted by your State as part of the delegation’s composition, the delegate will not be registered and included in the List of Participants.

The **Note Verbale** should state the organization's interest in participating in the meeting and list the names and titles of the members of the delegation. It should be sent via e-mail to [ccm@un.org](mailto:ccm@un.org), with the CCM ISU in copy at [info@cmconvention.org](mailto:info@cmconvention.org). The head of delegation should be clearly indicated. Observer status is granted by a decision of the Meeting, which will consider and decide on these requests at its opening session on **1 July 2026**.

## **Interpretation**

## **Getting to and from the Palais des Nations**

### *Tram and bus*

The Palais des Nations is served by several tram and bus lines: Buses 8, 20, 22 and F serve Pregny Gate (Appia stop) where the Pass and Identification Unit is located. Tram number 15, as well as buses 5, 8, 11, 20, 22 and F serve the Place des Nations (Nations stop). The Place des Nations, where the Nations Gate is located, is some 500 meters away from the Pregny Gate. Bus number 5 serves Cointrin Airport from the Place des Nations.
